

Astoria Area Chamber of Commerce
November 14, 2002

Pres. Beck called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m. at the town library. There were 13 members present and 2 guests.

The treasurer's report showed a current balance of \$2469.44. Kathleen Behymer made the motion to accept the treasurer's report with Nancy Carithers seconding.
